Vocabulary

- Continental drift the theory that the continents are moving very slowly.
 - Alfred Wegener proposed continental drift in 1915.
 - Wegener found evidence that the continents were once joined together in a giant supercontinent he called Pangaea. His theory states that, when Pangaea broke up, the continents slowly drifted to their current positions.
- Fossil the remains, traces, or imprint of an ancient living thing preserved in rock.
 - Fossils can be bones, shells, impressions, or even footprints.
- Glacier a large, slowly moving body of snow and ice.
- Ice age a time when Earth was very cold and large areas were covered by glaciers.
- Landmass a large, unbroken area of land.
- <u>Pangaea</u> an ancient supercontinent that scientists believe existed from about 200 to 300 million years ago.
- Supercontinent a single landmass that includes two or more continents.
